## The international conference Agrarian Perspectives XXIX.

Rural Facilitator project results were disseminated within the international scientific conference, that took place from 16th till 17th September 2020 at the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague. The conference intended to provoke discussion about the challenges and the future of European agriculture. The general topic of the conference provided not only a platform for discussing theoretical issues, but also for sharing experiences, identifying practical problems and exploring which solutions can be clarified with the assistance of the scientific community. This year, the main focus was on the topic “Trends and challenges in the agrarian sector”. The paper “Key competences of Short Food Supply Chain participants for the creation of alternative business models” written by the project partners was presented at the conference in the plenary session.
